## Father of NERICA among the world's most influential people



Father of NERICA Dr Monty Jones has been voted among the world's most influential people by the US Time magazine. Dr Jones is one of just five Africans on this year's list of 100 names.

Known as TIME 100, the selection is based on individuals whose ideas and achievements have changed the world and made history. The selected persons are grouped under five categories: Leaders & Revolutionaries, Builders & Titans, Artists & Entertainers, Scientists & Thinkers and Heroes & Pioneers.

Explaining the selection, the Time editorial stated "Yes, there are Presidents and dictators who can change the world through fiat, but we're more interested in

innovators like Monty Jones, the Sierra Leone scientist who has developed a strain of rice that can save African agriculture."

On receiving congratulations from WARDA, Dr Monty Jones replied, "This is an honor to all of us."

The award was presented by the West and Central African Council for Agricultural Research and Development (WECARD/CORAF) during its 20th anniversary celebration, 28-31 May 2007,

Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire. Dr Seck was until recently a member of Executive Committee of WECARD/CORAF.

Because of its historic ties with the countries of West and Central Africa and CORAF/ WECARD, WARDA was specially invited to exhibit its activities and achievements through posters and publications. Dr Sitapha Diatta, WARDA Representative in Côte d'Ivoire and other team members, helped set up the WARDA booth for the celebration.

# Bravo to WARDA Scientists and Research Assistants

- A book, "Market and economic development" edited by Ysuyuki Sawada and Tetsushi Sonobe (in Japanese) received "The 23rd Masayoshi Ohira Memorial Prize of 2007". WARDA scientists – T Sakurai and K Futakuchi – have authored a chapter in this book which was published in 2006.
- An important review paper "Increasing rice production in sub-Saharan Africa: challenges and opportunities" by V. Balasubramanian, M. Sié, R. J. Hijmans and K. Otsuka has just been published in Advances in Agronomy (Elsevier), Volume 94. This joint scientific publication in a leading reference serial heralds a new era of WARDA-IRRI partnership.

## Visitors to WARDA

- An Evaluation Team from the European Commission -- Drs David Coombs, Geneticist, and Rudy Ooijen, Economist -- visited WARDA-Cotonou, 7 - 9 May, to review EU-funded projects.



- Dr Edwin Nuijten, Department of Social Sciences, Technology and Agrarian Development, Wageningen University, visited WARDA-Cotonou, 21 May-1 June, as part of his study on the connection between rice genomics and resource-poor rice farmers in West-Africa.
- Mr Prosper H.M. Monde, Coordinator of the Question and Response Service (SQR), Benin visited WARDA-Cotonou on 25 May to meet with Dr Paul Van Mele and the WARDA Communications Unit in order to explain the activities of his program. SQR Benin is an initiative of the National Office of Support to Food Security (ONASA) of Benin and CTA.
- Catherine Mgendi, CGIAR Media Specialist, visited WARDA-Cotonou, 2 - 4 May. WARDA is one of the seven CGIAR Centers which have recruited her and a visit to each Center is part of her program. She interacted with the WARDA Communications Unit to develop her annual communication plan for the Center and interviewed researchers for possible media stories. During her visit, a meeting of journalists representing local, regional and international media agencies was organized in Cotonou to strengthen collaboration between research organizations and media.



As part of their work with the International Centre for Development-oriented Research in Agriculture (ICRA), France, Drs Toon Defoer and Marie-Josèphe Dugué visited WARDA-Cotonou on 14 May to explore possibilities for collaboration. Drs Defoer and Dugué are former staff members of WARDA.

## Workshops

- A workshop to support the agricultural value chain was organized jointly by the Belgian Embassy and the Ministry of Agriculture in Benin, 10-11 May, in Cotonou. About 50 participants representing research organizations, universities, local and international NGOs, farmers' associations, the private sector and donors participated. Dr Paul Van Mele and Jonas Wanvoëké actively participated in this meeting and made a presentation on WARDA's activities.
- The Regional Methodological Workshop relating to the project on "Stratification of rice and maize production systems in support for investment decisions in West Africa" was held at WARDA-Cotonou, 28 -30 May. Project coordinators from WARDA and IITA as well as national scientists from project member countries attended.
- An in-house Proposal Development Course titled "How to develop clear and persuasive proposals" was held at WARDA-Cotonou, 29 May to 1 June. About 25 participants, including scientists and research assistants attended.
- Dr Yoshimi Sokei, Thematic Group Leader of Technology Transfer organized a workshop on "Problem Analysis of NERICA Dissemination for ARI Coordinator in ARI SC" on 27 April 2007 at WARDA-Cotonou. The participants were ARI coordinators in each pilot country, their staff and ARI secretariat.

Soul Shava from Rhodes University's Environmental Education Unit, South Africa, is a Borlaug-Leadership Enhancement in Agriculture Programme (LEAP) doctoral fellow who was on a one month (April/May) research visit to WARDA under the supervision of Dr Paul Van Mele.
